Still Life

A still life is a work of art, which is most often a painting. In still-life, painting objects like flowers, fruit, or glasses are arranged in a particular artistic way and then painted. Most still-life are of inanimate objects man-made or natural. Still-life painting has been popular since the 17th century when Dutch painters like Adriaen Coorte raised it to fine art. However, still-life painting idea is old, examples can be found in antiquity. With still-life, the artist can focus more on composition and arrangement than with other forms of painting, such as landscape painting or portraiture.

HISTORY

Still-life is a genre that spans art history. It is found everywhere from ancient Egyptian tombs decorated with paintings of objects from daily life to works of modern art where it provided opportunities to experiment with new techniques, forms and styles. The painting generally considered to be the first still-life is a work by the Italian painter Jacopo de'Barbari painted 1504.

- Still-life painting as an independent genre or specialty which first flourished in the Netherlands during the early 1600s.
- Still-life art has existed from the 17th century until the modern-day. However, in the 19th century, artists adopted photography as a new medium for still-life art, to express their concepts in a novel format and thus the still-life photo was born on 08-Aug-2021

OBSERVATION

It is essential that we set up a space to sit and observe the items, this space should remain the same. We want to make sure that we are observing the scene from the same angle all the time. From where, we want to use our pencil to establish a basic horizon line.

LIGHT SKETCHING AND SKETCHING

This is the most important part of a still-life drawing because we are drawing from life, which means we are more likely to make mistakes. This is also why we want to retain our viewpoint for drawing. We don't want to be shifting to different sides, rather we want to draw from a single place.

THE FINAL STEP

As a general rule in pencil art, you should proceed from simple to complex shapes and details. Now you must refine the tones and add details, shades or texture while keeping in mind the values and the relative styles of the parts in the drawing. Depending on your choice you could continue with the same pencil or switch to different pencils. Finally, add some strokes of white chalk for the very brightest areas to finish the drawing.







DOODLE ART TIME

Doodle art is an art where a person lets ones heart out. It is referred to sketching, drawing, scribbling etc. Some are basic sketches that can be of abstract shapes. Doodle art is a form of drawing which is drawn without raising the hand. People often doodle when they are stressed or lonely.

There are four types of doodle art Zentangle, Zen doodle, Freeform and Zentangle-inspired. 5,00,000 years ago, our ancestors did not have paper, they did have cave walls, in this distant period is when some believe the first rough doodle-a zigzag line was created. A pig drawn nearly 50,000years back was the first animal doodle drawn.





Later in 1998 the concept of doodle was given a new life by the Google founders Larry and Sergey while making the logo for their company. The technique of doodle art involves too lightly trace the letter with a pencil, then draw a grid within the letter. Use the grid to create a pattern and use color and shading to highlight the letterform. To make it look more out -standing create a black and white background for it. Doodle art makes a person feel relieved and happy as one can let his feelings out.





ART KALAKRITI CLUB

"Calligraphy art" or "brush calligraphy," is a beautiful and expressive form of art that combines the artistic elements of traditional calligraphy with the visual aesthetics of painting. Prepare Your Workspace: Set up a clean and organized workspace. Make sure you have all your materials within easy reach.



The waves of doubt weather the weakest rocks



Of the long-gone memories and partial tales.



Conquer the Fear-Pole play


"I hear and I forget, I see and I remember, I do and I understand" – Confucius




The multi-cultural mega event 'World Fest', held for the students of Senior KG was a spectacular celebration that showcased the unity we have in our cultural diversity.
